East Elgin's Sportsmen's Association AGM & Elections

Unfortunately this years Annual General Meeting will once again be cancelled due to the government imposed restrictions on the number of people allowed at group gatherings. Indoor gatherings and events are currently restricted to a maximum of 50 people providing social distancing can be maintained. Quorum for 2021 is 60 members to hold a meeting and our facility does not have the capacity to seat 60 or more people and still adhere to the social distancing and gathering size restrictions. We will do our best to have all year end reports and documents from the club accountant and department heads made available by April 1st on our club website. We do realize this is not an optimal method and far from the type of open forum an AGM allows but under the current situation it is what we feel is a reasonable response to an unreasonable situation.

Range Rules Reminders



Every once in a while we find it necessary to remind everyone of a few of the rules at EESA that seem to be easily overlooked or forgotten. Over the past year with so many changes to some of the rules affected by covid a friendly reminder can make a big difference.

- Members are currently restricted to 1 guest at a time on all outdoor rages. This will help to ensure social distancing can be maintained.
- Members and Guests are asked to make use of 1 shooting station only

- Members are asked to make use of 1 station only. Storing your gear or your 2nd firearm on an open 2nd station prevents others from using that station.
- The indoor range is currently restricted to no more than 5 people at a time and no guests are permitted in the indoor range.
- Supervised shoot nights in the indoor range are restricted to new members in need of sign off only. This is temporary and strictly meant to permit more new shooters to gain their indoor access while the indoor range is limited to 5 shooters.

EESA and Covid

The Re-opening

On February 12th the provincial government announced regions will return to the Covic-19 response framework. (colour coding of regions)

EESA falls under the Southwest Public Health region which has now been designated as being in the Response Framework's orange zone.

Effective February 17th the indoor range was re-opened to members only, with a maximum of 5 people at a time in the shooting range area. Social distancing must still be maintained and allowing more than 5 at a time, or guests, will make that impossible. Masks must be worn at all times by anyone in the range or viewing area with absolutely no exceptions. Even if you are alone inside, a mask or face covering that completely covers the mouth and nose must be worn.

All outdoor ranges will remain open and will continue to keep every 2nd station closed to ensure social distancing is maintained, members will however be allowed to bring 1 guest.

We appreciate everyone doing their part and abiding by the newest restrictions. So far in our region the number of cases have been decreasing at a steady pace and hopefully before the nicest shooting weather arrives we'll be back at it in full swing.


Club Upgrades

Hydro Supply Upgrade

Target Retrieval System




Recently we've seen our current target retrieval system in the indoor range start to fail at a much more frequent rate and we felt it was time to consider a new system before we have a critical breakdown and find ourselves with no working target system in the indoor range.

With that said, starting April 19th the indoor range will be closed until April 23 for the installation of a brand new target retrieval system by <u>Caliber Target Systems</u> in Brantford. This is an upgrade that will last us for a lot of years to come.


